Sign The Return Envelope

The voter must sign the return envelope. In order for a mail ballot to be counted, the signature on the returned voter's certificate must match the voter registration signature on file. A Power of Attorney is not recognized for voting.

Returning Your Mail Ballot

Mail ballots must be received in the Elections Office by 7:00 P.M. on November 3, 2020 in order to be counted. You have many options to return your voted mail ballot.


- Secure drop boxes are available at all early voting sites during voting hours.
- A secure drop box is available at the Elections Office 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- If you plan to mail your ballot, send it early! Allow at least 7 days for delivery.
- **DO NOT** bring your voted mail ballot to a precinct voting location on Election Day, it must be returned directly to the Elections Office on Election Day.

Voting In Person With A Mail Ballot

If you have requested and received a mail ballot but decide to vote in person, bring your ballot with you to the polls. The mail ballot will be cancelled and you will be issued a new ballot at the polling location. You cannot use a mail ballot as a sample ballot in the voting booth. Instead, bring this sample ballot with you to use as a reference.
