Attention Voters: **Florida Is A Closed Primary State**

A closed Primary means you must be a registered voter in the party for which the Primary is being held. All registered voters, regardless of party affiliation, may vote the nonpartisan ballot and Universal Primary Contests. Deadline to register to vote or change your party affiliation: **July 25, 2022**

If you are registered as a **REPUBLICAN**, you will vote a Republican ballot which also includes all nonpartisan contests and the Universal Primary Contest.

If you are registered as a **DEMOCRAT**, you will vote a Democratic ballot which also includes all nonpartisan contests and the Universal Primary Contest.

ALL REGISTERED VOTERS regardless of political party affiliation may vote for nonpartisan contests and the Universal Primary Contest. **All voters who reside in the City of Palm Coast** may vote for the City Council race on this ballot.

Why are Primary Elections so important?

These contests will be decided in this Primary!

There is one Universal Primary Contest this year which will be decided in the Primary. These candidates share the same political party affiliation and face no opposition in the General Election. All registered voters in the county are eligible to vote for:

- **Board of County Commissioners, District 2**

Nonpartisan contests with two candidates are always decided in a Primary Election. All registered voters in the county are eligible to vote for these nonpartisan contests:

- **School Board, District 1 & School Board, District 4**

Nonpartisan contests with more than two candidates can be decided in a Primary if one candidate receives a majority of the vote (over 50%). Otherwise, the two candidates which receive the highest votes will have a runoff in the General Election. All registered voters in the county are eligible to vote for School Board Members. Palm Coast voters may vote for Council Member:

- **School Board, District 2**
- **City of Palm Coast Council Member, District 2**

Palm Coast Council Member, District 4 will appear on the General Election ballot.

ELECTION READY CHECKLIST



✓ Register To Vote:

Have you recently moved to Flagler County? Florida residents can use Online Voter Registration to register to vote or update their registration. You may also register to vote or update your registration by mail or in person. The voter registration deadline is **July 25, 2022** for this Primary. ✓ Update Your Party Affiliation:

Florida is a closed Primary state. If you wish to vote for a partisan office in this Primary Election, you must be a registered voter in the party for which the Primary is being held. All registered voters, regardless of party affiliation, may vote in Universal Primary Contests and nonpartisan races in a Primary Election. The party change deadline for the upcoming Primary Election is **July 25, 2022**. To change your party affiliation to vote in this election, please visit: FlaglerElections.gov/vote

✓ Update Your Residence Address:

If you have moved since the last election, you need to update your address before you vote. Call (386) 313-4170 or change your address online: FlaglerElections.gov/vote

✓ Make A Plan To Vote:

There are three ways to vote in Florida. Any voter can choose to vote by mail, vote early, or vote on Election Day. Early voting locations and precinct changes are on the reverse side of this sample ballot. If you choose to vote on Election Day, you must vote in your assigned precinct location. ✓ Bring Your ID:

Florida Law requires each voter to present both photo and signature identification at the polls. Expired ID's will not be accepted.

Vote On Election Day

Registered voters who choose to vote on Election Day must cast their ballot at their assigned polling place. Polls are always open from 7:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. Refer to your Voter Information Card to find the name and address of your polling place.

Precinct boundaries were updated in May of this year after redistricting to align our precincts with the new districts. Changes were made to balance voter populations in neighboring precincts. Two smaller precincts were combined into a larger facility to safely accommodate the expected turnout.

Vote Early

Any registered voter may choose to vote during early voting.

Vote-By-Mail

Any registered voter may request their ballot by mail. Request a mail ballot using the form below or call the Elections Office at (386) 313-4170. All voted mail ballots must be received by the Elections Office by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. A postmark does not extend this deadline. Drop boxes (secure ballot intake stations) for mail ballots will be available at all early voting sites during polling hours. Ballots can also be returned directly to the Supervisor of Elections office in Bunnell. The mail ballot request deadline is **August 13, 2022**.

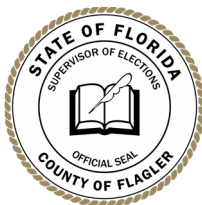
OFFICIAL SAMPLE BALLOT

Please take this sample ballot with you when voting in person and use it as a reference.

Did you know that several local contests will be decided in this election? Your vote counts! **County Commission District 2, School Board District 1, and School Board District 4 will be decided in this Primary Election.** All registered voters in the county may vote for these contests, including voters without a party affiliation and those who are registered with a minor party. **Voter turnout for Primary elections in Flagler County averages less than 30%.** All elections are important, don't skip this Primary!

You may choose to vote either by mail, during early voting, or at your assigned precinct on Election Day. This sample ballot shows the ballot for the entire county, not just your precinct. Your representative districts, precinct number, and polling location are shown on your Voter Information Card. If you have moved since the last time you voted and did not update your registration, please call the Elections Office and change your address over the phone.
