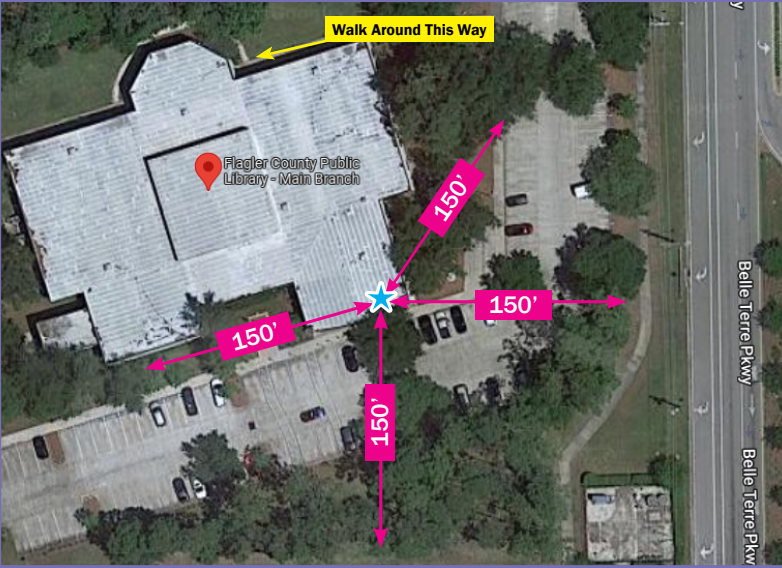


# NO-SOLICITATION ZONES: EARLY VOTING LOCATIONS



The 150’ zone is measured from the entrance of the polling location, or the mail ballot drop box, if the box is outside.

## FLAGLER COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARY



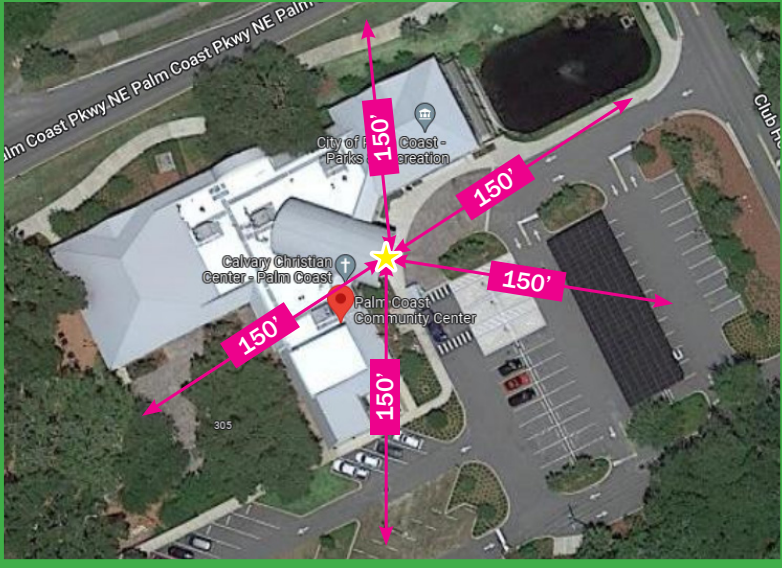
### Inside of the Zone:

- ★ No volunteers or candidates wearing campaign apparel. Walk around the building to the other side.
- ★ No campaign signs.
- ★ No public restrooms on Sunday because the library is closed.

### Outside of the Zone:

- ★ Do not place signs in the ground outside of the 150’ zone.
- ★ Tents must be taken down each day.
- ★ No overnight parking.

## PALM COAST COMMUNITY CENTER



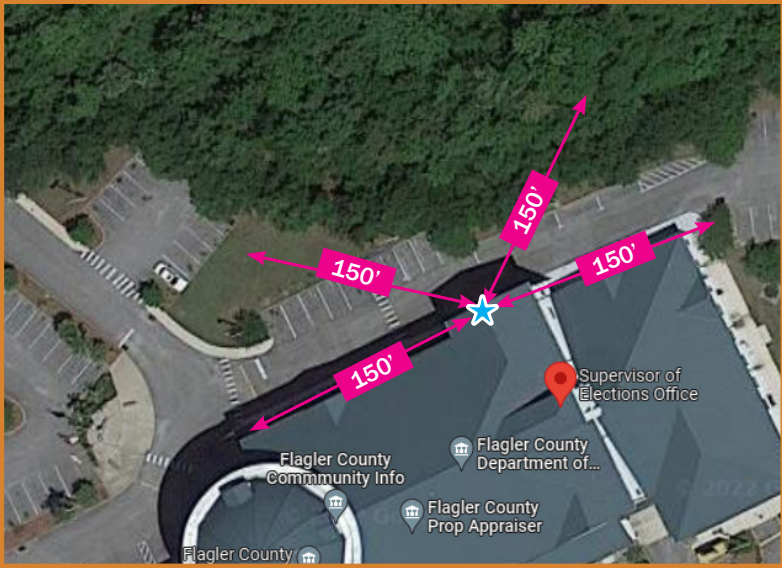
### Inside of the Zone:

- ★ No volunteers or candidates wearing campaign apparel.
- ★ No campaign signs.

### Outside of the Zone:

- ★ Signs must be held outside of the 150’ zone.
- ★ No tents in the right of way. Tents must be taken down each day.
- ★ No overnight parking.

## SUPERVISOR OF ELECTIONS OFFICE



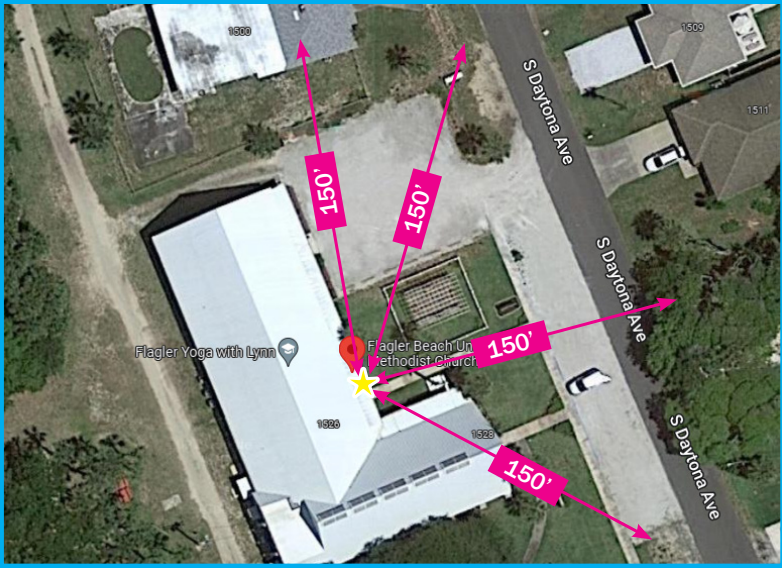
### Inside of the Zone:

- ★ No volunteers or candidates wearing campaign apparel.
- ★ No campaign signs.

### Outside of the Zone:

- ★ Do not place signs in the ground outside of the 150’ zone.
- ★ Tents must be taken down each day.
- ★ No overnight parking.

## FLAGLER BEACH UNITED METHODIST CHURCH



### Inside of the Zone:

- ★ No volunteers or candidates wearing campaign apparel.
- ★ No campaign signs.
- ★ No public restrooms at this location because they are inside the polling room.

### Outside of the Zone:

- ★ No campaign signs in the ground.
- ★ No tents in the right of way, must be 200 sq. ft. or less, only on the North side of this location, must be taken down each day.
- ★ No overnight parking.

## Political Signs

Do not place signs in the ground on public property. Signs must be attended and cannot be left out overnight.

No Solicitation Zone: Section 102.131, Florida Statutes

The “No Solicitation Zone” is 150 feet from the polling place entrance.

Please Walk Around The No Solicitation Zone. Campaign volunteers and/or candidates themselves wearing campaign t-shirts, hats or buttons may not walk through the 150’ zone throughout the day. Unless a campaign volunteer is going inside to vote or use the library or community center facilities, there should be no foot traffic through this area. Our trained election workers (sworn poll deputies stationed outside) have to assume that anyone wearing campaign apparel, carrying a sign or literature to distribute is there to solicit voters. The law very clearly prohibits this activity and the poll deputy will ask you to leave the area. Voters may wear campaign apparel when they visit a polling place.

The No Solicitation Zone is in effect during Early Voting and at our Election Day voting precincts. It also applies before 10:00 A.M. (or 7:00 A.M. on Election Day) when voters may or may not be waiting in line.

Please be respectful of Elections Office staff and election workers who are doing their job to monitor the 150’ No Solicitation Zone. The same requirement will be reinforced for Elections staff to be respectful as well.

Violations:

The following activities are prohibited within the No Solicitation Zone:

- ★ Distribution of campaign materials inside a public area which is within 150 feet and adjacent to the polling room (also includes inside the library, inside the community center, inside the Elections Office)
- ★ Approaching vehicles and/or persons in their car with pamphlets or materials
- ★ Blocking traffic, stopping the flow of traffic or walking out into traffic
- ★ Aggressive campaigning and the use of bullhorns, megaphones and/or loud speakers
- ★ Repeatedly walking through the 150-foot no-solicitation zone

The Supervisor of Elections or the clerk may take any reasonable action necessary to ensure order at the polling places, including, but not limited to, having disruptive and unruly persons removed by law enforcement officers from the polling room or place or from the 150-foot zone surrounding the polling place.

Voter Intimidation: Section 104.0615, Florida Statutes

A person may not directly or indirectly use or threaten to use force, violence, or intimidation or any tactic of coercion or intimidation to induce or compel an individual to:

- ★ Vote or refrain from voting;
- ★ Vote or refrain from voting for any particular individual or ballot measure;
- ★ Refrain from registering to vote; or
- ★ Refrain from acting as a legally authorized election official or poll watcher.

A person may not knowingly use false information to:

- ★ Challenge an individual’s right to vote;
- ★ Induce or attempt to induce an individual to refrain from voting or registering to vote;

A person who violates subsection (2), subsection (3), or subsection (4) commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

BEST PRACTICES

**Campaign beyond 150 feet from the entrance from any polling place.**

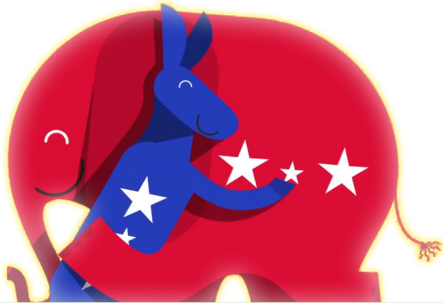
