BE ELECTION READY

Voter ID Law Expanded in Florida

Voters may now use their Veteran's Affairs Health Insurance Card, a Florida Concealed Weapons License or a Governmentissued Employee ID when they go to vote. Photo and signature ID is always required at the polls in Florida. This law expands the list to include common sense options, which will help voters present an acceptable form of identification at the polling place. This is simply great news for voters in Florida. Here is a list of acceptable ID's at the polling place:

- 1. Florida driver license.
- 2. Florida identification card issued by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles.
- 3. United States passport.
- 4. Debit or credit card.
- 5. Military identification.
- 6. Student identification.
- 7. Retirement center identification.
- 8. Neighborhood association identification.

> Early Voting: August 15 - August 27

> > Election Day: August 30

General Election

Deadline to register to vote or change your party: **October 11**

Early Voting: October 24 - November 5

Election Day: November 8

Polls are always open from 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.

Effective April 1, 2016:

- 10. Veteran health identification card issued by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.
- 11. A license to carry a concealed weapon or firearm issued pursuant to s. 790.06.
- 12. Employee identification card issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the Federal Government, the state, a county, or a municipality.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



Over the past several years, I have taken note of the most frequently asked questions which we receive in the Elections Office. This section of the newsletter will highlight one question and provide an answer to a question we hear often.

Q: Can someone pick up or return a Vote-By-Mail (absentee) ballot for me?

A: You may name, in writing, a designee to pick up a ballot for you, no earlier than five days before an election, and provide certain required information. The designee for pick-up must provide identification. You can also have someone else return your ballot.

OFFICE HAPPENINGS

Federal Grant for New Voting Equipment

I have been leading the charge with two other Supervisors of Elections to negotiate with the Department of State to secure Federal grant funding at a state level to purchase new voting equipment in Flagler County. These grant funds will help our county and twelve (12) other small counties in Florida update their aged voting systems. A total of **\$147,136** has been approved for Flagler County. We are working together towards great fiscal stewardship of tax dollars!

Primary Election Turnout

Turnout in Flagler County follows statewide trends and is higher during Presidential Election cycles. This chart shows Primary Election turnout for the past six Presidential Election years. Historical turnout and results analysis must be considered as we prepare for the upcoming Primary Election to be held on August 30, 2016.
